

Church of Assumption of Our Lady, Torquay Minutes of Parish Pastoral Council Meeting 30.11.17

HH opened the meeting with prayer.

No new conflicts of interest.

Minutes 29.9.17 agreed and signed by Chair

Action points from last minutes:

Book of Remembrance:

MH had done some research for a suitable format for proposed Book of Remembrance. He has looked into a physical book and digital format in the form of an ipad. A physical book was agreed. Fr K will ask at the Crematorium and Funeral Directors' for best place to purchase such a book so we have a price comparison. MH furnished us with a thorough piece of research with a book ranging from £550-£1000. The book will stand on a plinth in a place to be decided in the Church with a page or two pages for each day. Some discussion was had about whether a donation for an entry would be requested/suggested. HH and Fr K suggested fundraising via an Ester Raffle, this was agreed as a good idea. MH told the meeting of an anonymous donor who has pledged £300 towards the cost.

Board for Clergy who have served as Priests in the Parish:

Fr K told the meeting that he and Deacon Robert will meet TRIGGS the Stonemasons in the New Year and so will report back at the next meeting about cost and possible types.

Re-ordering of Sanctuary - Fr K reported that Historic Churches had said no to moving the marble from Stoodley to our Sanctuary. This was because the chapel was built in the 1970S and so did not fit with historic status of the Church. Further exploration will be made. Fr K is hoping that the stone form the altar at Stoodley could be used for the Ambo in Church. Possible new architects will be sought when re-ordering is planned. Permission to reframe the Stations of the Cross has been agreed and these will be re-sited individually around the Church.

<u>Bishop's Visitation</u>- Fr K confirmed Bishop Mark will visit the Parish on the weekend of 17th/18th March. Plans as they are will mean the Bishop will preach at both Masses on 18th but Celebrate at 10.30 Mass. Parish groups and individuals will be able to meet with Bishop Mark over the weekend. An Irish Ceilidh is to be planned for that weekend.

<u>Advent/Christmas</u> - Masses on Christmas Eve, 8.30 and 10.30. Midnight Mass on Christmas Eve. Christmas Day Masses at 8.00 and 10.30. During Advent there will be a Holy Hour 4-5pm led by Deacon Robert. Reconciliation Service, 12th Dec at 6pm. Praise group to provide music.

New Year's Day Mass at 10.30

During Masses on the 3rd Sunday of Advent, Father Kieran will bless 'Bambinos' (from Cribs). Cribfest – there will be a Cribfest held over the Epiphany weekend. Parishioners will be invited to bring their Cribs to Mass and leave them to be displayed. There will be competition for children to make a homemade crib. A box for donations to CCS, Plymouth and there will also be a raffle over the weekend in aid of CCS Plymouth.

All children attending the children's liturgy & First Communion Sessions will be provided with a small Nativity/Crib box. They will be invited to take these home and fill with coins, with thoughts of children who aren't as lucky as they may be. Boxes to be returned on the weekend of $6^{th}/7^{th}$ Jan.

Tea/coffee – a note will be included in the newsletter about the amount suggested for tea/coffee after Mass. A new sign is displayed during coffee to let people know where their donations go.

De-Fibrillator

Fr Kieran will seek funding from Rotary or Catenians to cover cost of installing a de-fibrillator (approx. £900+£300). Up to 6 people will need to be trained. ACTION

<u>Parish directory</u>- Sr Benignus brought to the meeting of the need for a Parish directory. The document will itemise all resources for the Parish, with contact details. A welcome pack and registration form could be included for new parishioners. Sr Benignus and Augustine will work together to create a directory. Note to be appear in newsletter for people running groups to make contact with Sr B via email. ACTION

A parishioner has asked if it would be possible to publish to dates of PPC meetings in advance of meetings. Minutes will continue to be published in the newsletter, as will the dates of meetings. ACTION **Requiem Mass book** – PW addressed the meeting with a need for a requiem Mass book for those who don't attend/haven't attended Church for a while. Paul talk about the possibility of evangelisation coming from attendance at a funeral where such a book was available. Sr B will bring a small booklet she has that is used at funerals and share it with Fr K. ACTION

AOB:

Through the Evangelisation team a booklet called Rediscover Jesus will be distributed in the Parish. A benefactor from USA has paid for 3000 copies in the Diocese, 200 for our Parish. These will be offered to anyone who joins us at Christmas Masses, as a present. Dates for diary:
